Assistant Chief Beebe took the lead and started working on the application process for the EMX Flex Grant. The Plymouth Fire was awarded \$89,005, with a shortfall of \$150,000 from the original request. The department found a different avenue for the purchase of an ambulance. Motion was made by Nelson/Hildebrand to approve the purchase of a 2013 Braun Ambulance from Elite Ambulance Sales for the

- price of \$83,000 from the funds acquired through the Wisconsin DHS Flex Grant. Upon the call of the roll, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Approve the Body-Worn Cameras Grant Deputy Police Chief/Interim Police Chief Starker explained in October 2022 the Police Department submitted an application to the Department of Justice for a body worn camera grant. The BWC Grant is a match grant, which means the state will pay 50% of the total cost. The department was awarded \$3,300 from the grant. The department will use money from a Safer Community Grant to cover the \$1,650. Motion was made by Odekirk/Hansen to approve the Body Worn Camera Grant. Upon the call of the roll, all voted aye. 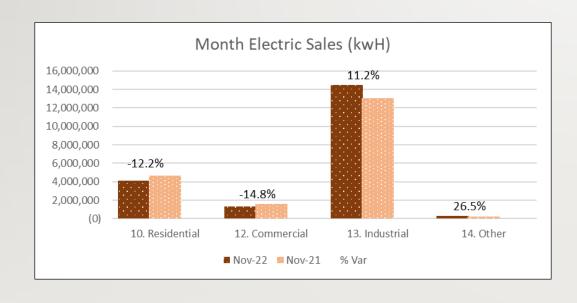

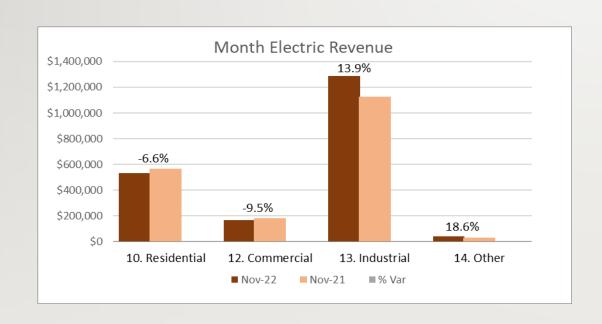
November 2022 Electric Sales

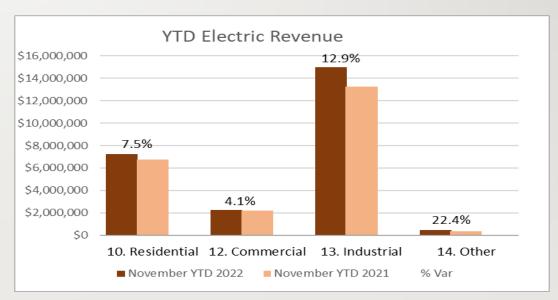




2022 Electric total sales volumes are similar to 2021.

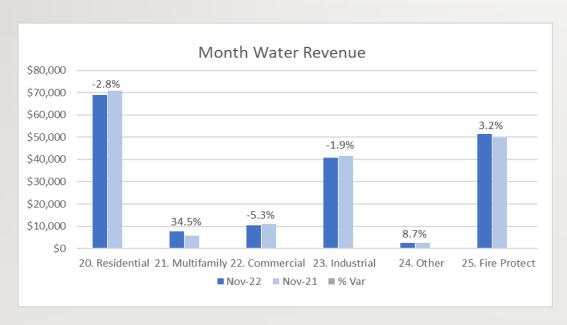
November 2022 Electric Revenue

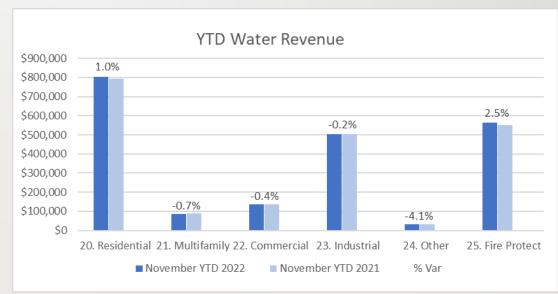




2022 Electric Revenue is up 10.6% over 2021, driven mainly by increased purchased power costs in 2022.

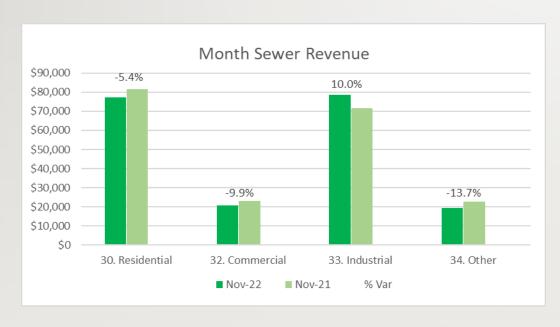
November 2022 Water Revenue





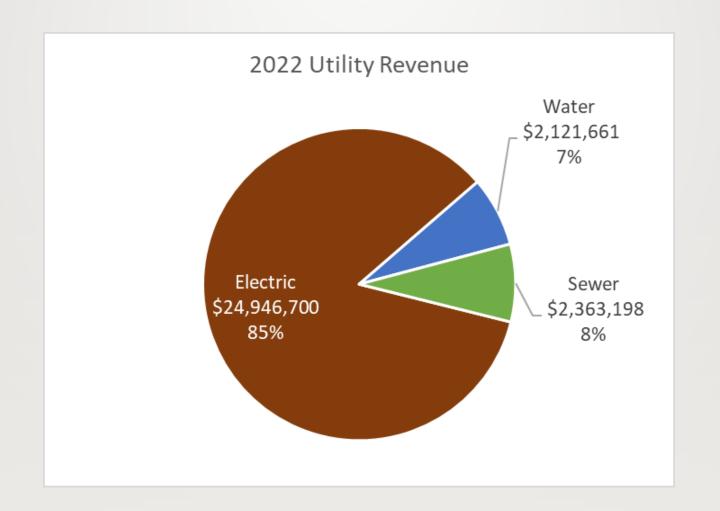

Attached you will find the changes to City Ordinance 11-2-1 for Regulation of Firearms, Explosives, and other Missiles.

The change in ordinance was needed to comply with Wisconsin Act 71 relating to restrictions imposed by local governmental units on hunting with a bow and arrow or crossbow.

The change allows for individuals to hunt within the city limits with a bow and arrow or crossbow as long as the arrow or bolt is discharged towards the ground.

The hunting also has to take place at a distance of more then 100 yards from a dwelling used for human occupancy unless the hunting is being done by the homeowner or someone living within the dwelling.

CITY OF PLYMOUTH, WISCONSIN Ordinance No. _____ of 2022

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 11-2-1 OF THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH CODE OF GENERAL ORDINANCES RELATED TO REGULATION OF FIREARMS, EXPLOSIVES, AND OTHER MISSILES

WHEREAS, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 29.038 the Wisconsin legislature has enacted laws regarding local regulation of wild animals; and

WHEREAS, Section 11-2-1 of the City of Plymouth Code of General Ordinances is no longer consistent with these state law provisions; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council has determined that an amendment to Section 11-2-1 will promote the public health and safety of the citizens in the City of Plymouth.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Common Council of the City of Plymouth, Wisconsin, does hereby ordain as follows:

Section 1. Amending Code. Section 11-2-1, Regulation of Firearms, Explosives and Other Missiles, is hereby amended to read as follows (additions shown by underscore, deletions by strikeout):

"SEC. 11-2-1 REGULATION OF FIREARMS, EXPLOSIVES, AND OTHER MISSILES.

- (a) **Discharge of Firearms Regulated.** No person, except a police officer or other law enforcement officer in the performance of an official duty, shall fire or discharge any firearm, rifle, spring gun, air gun or pneumatic pellet gun of any description in his possession or under his control within the City of Plymouth, provided that this Section shall not prevent the maintenance and use of duly supervised rifle or pistol ranges or shooting galleries authorized by the Common Council, or the firing or discharging of BB guns upon private premises by persons over sixteen (16) or under the direct personal supervision of a parent or guardian, provided the projectile does not leave the premises.
- (b) Hunting Prohibited Discharge Permit. Hunting Discharge of any firearm within the City is prohibited, but the Chief of Police may issue written permits to owners or occupants of private premises to hunt or shoot discharge on such premises if he finds such privileges necessary for the protection of life or property, and subject to such safeguards as he may impose for the safety of the lives and property of other persons within the City of Plymouth.
- (c) **Shooting Into City Limits.** No person shall in the territory adjacent to the City discharge any firearm in such manner that the discharge shall enter or fall within the City.
- (d) **Shooting Ranges.** This Section shall not prevent the maintenance and use of duly supervised rifle or pistol ranges or shooting galleries approved by the

Common Council, upon the recommendation of the Chief of Police, where proper safety precautions are taken.

- (e) **Explosive Devices.** No person shall discharge or detonate any dynamite, nitroglycerin or other explosive within the City without first obtaining a permit to do so from the Common Council.
- (f) Throwing or Shooting of Arrows, Stones, or Other Missiles Prohibited.
 - (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to discharge or cause the discharge of any dangerous missile from any slingshot, bow and arrow, <u>crossbow</u> or other means within <u>six hundred one hundred</u> (600 100) feet <u>yards</u> of any inhabited dwelling or building or any public park, square or enclosure <u>located</u> on another person's land, unless discharge is allowed by the owner of the <u>land on which the building is located</u>. A person that hunts with a bow and arrow or crossbow shall discharge the arrow or bolt from the weapon toward the ground. No person shall discharge any dangerous missile on City property.
 - (2) This Subsection shall not apply:
 - a. To the shooting or discharging of toy arrows or arrows which have a tip made of rubber or similar material.
 - b. To a supervised archery range approved by the Common Council.
 - c. Within the interior of a single-family dwelling.
- (g) **Definitions.** For purposes of this Section, a firearm is defined as any instrumentality from or with which a shot, bullet or pellet may be discharged or expelled, regardless of whether the propelling force is provided by air, spring, or other similar mechanical device, or gun powder."

2013 WISCONSIN ACT 71

AN ACT to renumber and amend 29.038 (3); and to create 29.038 (3) (b) of the statutes; relating to: restrictions imposed by local governmental units on hunting with a bow and arrow or crossbow.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 29.038 (3) of the statutes is renumbered 29.038 (3) (a) and amended to read:

29.038 (3) (a) A Except as provided in par. (b), a local governmental unit may enact an ordinance or adopt a regulation, resolution or other restriction that has an incidental effect on hunting, fishing or trapping, but only if the primary purpose is to further public health or safety.

SECTION 2. 29.038 (3) (b) of the statutes is created to read:

29.038 (3) (b) 1. In this paragraph:

- a. "Building" means a permanent structure used for human occupancy and includes a manufactured home, as defined in s. 101.91 (2).
- b. "Restriction" means an ordinance, regulation, resolution, or other restriction enacted or adopted by a local governmental unit.
- 2. Except as provided in subd. 3., a local governmental unit may not enact or adopt a restriction that prohibits a person from hunting with a bow and arrow or crossbow within the jurisdiction of that local governmental unit.
 - 3. A local governmental unit may enact or adopt a restriction that does any of the following:
- a. Prohibits a person from hunting with a bow and arrow or crossbow within a specified distance, not to exceed 100 yards, from a building located on another person's land. A restriction enacted or adopted under this subd. 3. a. shall provide that the restriction does not apply if the person who owns the land on which the building is located allows the hunter to hunt within the specified distance of the building.
- b. Requires a person who hunts with a bow and arrow or crossbow to discharge the arrow or bolt from the respective weapon toward the ground.

Background:

The City owns the former Strutz Financial building north of Stayer Jr. Park. The building is in blighted condition, has water damage, and sits in the floodway. A community effort was made several years ago to demolish the building and turn it into a shelter, but it quickly become cost prohibitive.

In November, Staff received information about the new Vibrant Spaces Grant program currently being offered by the State of Wisconsin. The new Vibrant Spaces Grant, a pilot program within the Community Development Investment (CDI) Grant Program, is designed to assist with creating vibrant and engaging communities. Grants in amounts from \$25,000 to \$50,000 are available to help local communities develop and enhance public spaces.

In the FY23 competitive grant cycle, no more than 30 grants will be awarded. Applicants must agree to provide a 1:1 match of the grant amount. Competitive projects will:

- Incorporate multiple improvements within or associated with one public space
- Demonstrate community engagement and support via a community document/plan and/or via letters of support from public, private and civic partners
- Be ready to begin construction during 2023
- Increase the number and type of audiences using the space
- Create visible and lasting transformations that foster public activity

Staff believes the former Strutz Financial Building space is an ideal candidate for \$25,000 Vibrant Spaces Grant to develop a pocket park due to its proximity with Stayer Jr. Park, its creation of visible and lasting transformation of public space for downtown visitors, and because the 2022 Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Pap designates Parcel 59271813530 for Parks and Open Space. In addition, a private donor has agreed to demolish the Strutz Financial Building as an inkind contribution as part of this project.

Staff worked with Hardwood Engineering Consultants to develop a draft concept plan and budget for the space. It is intended that demolition would begin in 2023. Per the grant requirements, having a concept plan, draft budget, and 2023 project start timeline add strength to the grant application. The concept itself could be modified in the future to accommodate minor changes. If the grant was awarded, the estimated project cost would be \$51,403 of which \$25,000 be covered by the grant. Should the grant be awarded and accepted, funding for the project would be provided via American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) or the City's Capital Project Fund.

A resolution of support for the project is required per the grant application, it is attached for review and approval. Staff will then finalize writing the grant application prior to the January 31, 2023 deadline.

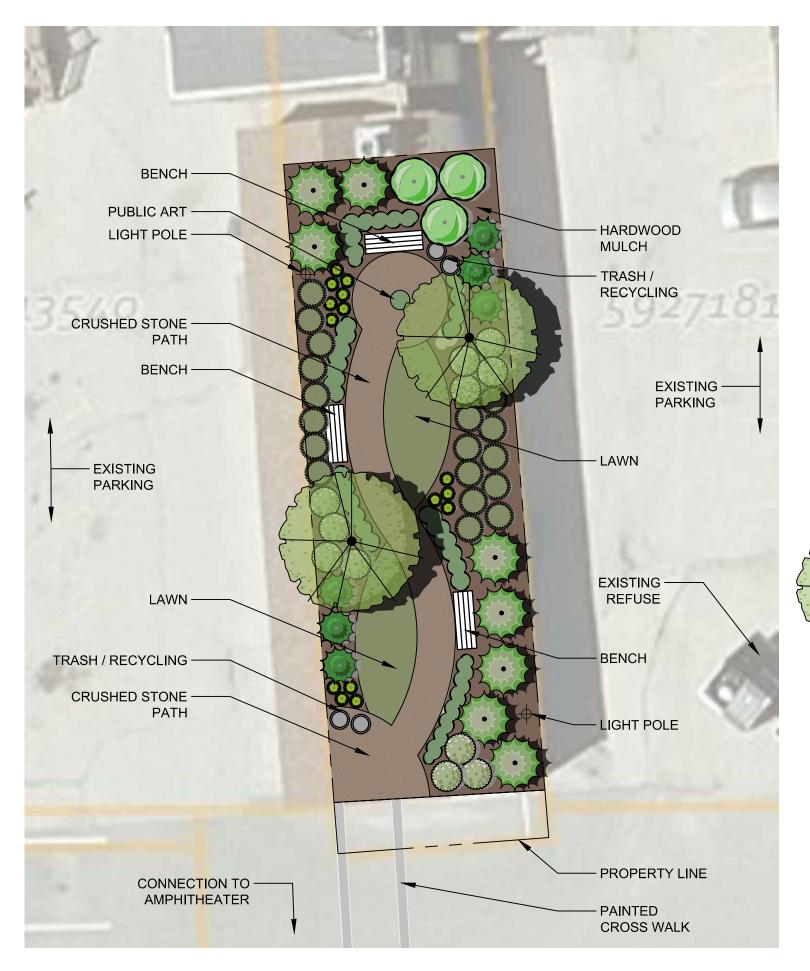

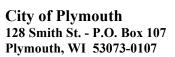

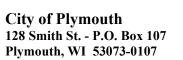
Background:

The Electric Department needs to replace the 2005 Digger Derrick truck. We received quotes from three vendors for a 60' boom mounted on an International tandem axle frame.

1)Terex - \$450,000

2) USSI - \$412,617

3) Altec - \$367,607

Staff recommends purchase of the Digger from Altec for \$367,607. This purchase will not take place until 2024, but as a result of the year-plus lead time it needs to be ordered in 2023. Staff included \$375,000 as the estimated cost of the truck in 2024 as part of the 10-year Plymouth Utilities Capital Improvement Plan.
