Additional Information

May be Granted and Issued only to:

- (1) Bona fide clubs that have been in existence for at least 6 months prior to the date of application.
- (2) State, county, or local fair associations, or agricultural societies.
- (3) Church, lodge, or society that has been in existence for at least 6 months prior to the date of application.
- (4) Posts now or hereafter established of ex-servicemen's organizations.
- (5) Chambers of commerce or similar civic or trade organizations.

Application:

- (1) Filing: In writing, for each event, on Form AT-315.
- (2) The local licensing authority may act on application or authorize an official or body of the municipality to issue the license. (ss. 125.26(1) and 125.51(1)(a), Wis. Stats.)
- (3) The written application shall be filed with the clerk of the municipality in which premises are located:

Class "B" (Beer):

- a. The governing body shall establish any waiting period before granting of a license for events lasting less than 4 days (s. 125.04(3)(f), Wis. Stats.)
- b. At least 15 days prior to the granting of the license for events lasting 4 or more days.

"Class B" (Wine)

The application shall be filed with the clerk of the local municipality in which the event will be held at least 15 days prior to the granting of the license.

- (4) Seller's Permit: Sec. 77.54 (7m), Wis. Stats., provides an exemption from Wisconsin sales and use taxes relating to certain sales by a nonprofit organization. Check the box if your organization qualifies for the exemption and therefore is not required to hold a seller's permit.
- (5) Publication: Not required.

Fee: Determined by the municipality, but may not exceed \$10. (Exception: No additional fee may be charged if organization is applying for both a Temporary Class "B" and a Temporary "Class B" license for the same event.)

Duration: The day, or consecutive days, that the specified event is in progress. A municipality may issue up to 20 licenses to the same licensee for a single event, if each license is issued for the same date and time.

Restrictions:

- (1) License may not be issued to individuals.
- (2) Licenses to organizations, other than ex-servicemen's organizations, can be issued only for a picnic or similar gathering. They may not be issued for business or social meetings of the organization.
- (3) Licenses for club or organization meetings may be issued only to ex-servicemen's posts.
- (4) License may cover either a specified area or the entire picnic grounds.
- (5) License issued to a county or district fair must cover the entire fairground (ss. 125.26(6) and 125.51(10), Wis. Stats.)
- (6) No license to clubs having any indebtedness to any wholesaler for more than 15 days for beer (s. 125.33(7), Wis. Stats.) and 30 days for wine (s. 125.69(4)(b), Wis. Stats.)
- (7) Licensed operator(s) must be present at all times (ss. 125.26(6), 125.32(2) Beer; 125.51(10), 125.68(2) Wine; 125.17)
- (8) The licensed club, club members, or any other persons are not permitted to possess intoxicating liquor on licensed premises on the Temporary Class B"/"Class B" licensed picnic area. (s. 125.32(6), Wis. Stats.)
- (9) Not more than 2 wine licenses may be issued to any club, county or local fair association, agricultural association, church, lodge, society, chamber of commerce or similar civic or trade organization or veterans' post in any 12 month period. A municipality may issue up to 20 wine licenses to the same licensee if: 1) each license is issued for the same date and times, 2) the licensee is the sponsor of an event held at multiple locations within the municipality on this date and at these times, 3) an admission fee is charged for participation in the event and no additional fee is charged for service of alcohol beverages at the event, and 4) within the immediately preceding 12-month period, the municipality has issued these multiple licenses for fewer than 2 events. In addition, each event for which multiple licenses are issued shall count as one license toward the 2-license limit.
- (10) Licensed organizations must purchase their product from a licensed wholesaler.

NOTE: Most coolers presently on the market have a fermented malt beverage base allowing sale under a beer license, e.g. Bartles and James, Seagrams, etc.

TO: All Temporary Fermented Malt Beverage or Wine License Applicants

Please be aware that upon issuance of a Temporary Fermented Malt Beverage and/or Wine License, you MUST be aware of the City of Plymouth Municipal Code Sec. 7-2-15 – See Attached.

REMEMBER

- You must have a City of Plymouth licensed bartender stationed at all points of alcohol beverage sales at all times.
- You must post, in a conspicuous location at the main point of sale and at all remote points, a sign stating that no alcoholic beverages will be served to anyone under the age of 21.
- You must post the approved City of Plymouth license in a conspicuous location where the alcohol beverages are being served.

SEC. 7-2-15 RESTRICTIONS ON TEMPORARY FERMENTED MALT BEVERAGE OR WINE LICENSES.

It shall be unlawful for any person or organization on a temporary basis to sell or offer to sell any alcohol beverage upon any City-owned property or privately-owned property within the City of Plymouth, except through the issuance of a Temporary Class "B" Fermented Malt Beverage License or Temporary "Class B" Wine License issued by the Common Council in accordance with Wisconsin Statutes and as set forth in this Section. A Temporary Class "B" Fermented Malt Beverage License or Temporary "Class B" Wine License authorizing the sale and consumption of beer and/or wine on City-owned property or privately-owned property may be authorized by the Common Council provided the following requirements are met:

- (a) **Compliance with Eligibility Standards.** The organization shall meet the eligibility requirements of a bona fide club, chamber of commerce, association, lodge or society as set forth in Sec. 125.26(6), Wis. Stats., and shall fully comply with the requirements of this Section and Section 11-4-1.
- (b) **Posting of Signs and Licenses.** All organizations issued a temporary license shall post in a conspicuous location at the main point of sale and at all remote points, signs stating that no fermented malt beverage shall be served to any underage person.
- (c) **Fencing.** If necessary due to the physical characteristics of the site, the Common Council may require that organizations install fencing as so determined by the Chief of Police or his or her designee which may include a double fence around the main point of sale to control ingress and egress and continually station a licensed operator, security guard or other competent person at the entrance for the purpose of checking age identification. Where possible, there shall be only one (1) point of ingress and egress. When required, the double fence shall be a minimum of four (4) feet high and a minimum of six (6) feet between fences.
- (d) **Underage Persons Prohibited.** No person under the age of eighteen, unless properly licensed as an operator, shall be allowed to assist in the sale of fermented malt beverages or wine at any point of sale. No underage person as defined by the Wisconsin Statutes shall be allowed to loiter or linger in the area of any point of sale, unless working as a licensed operator or accompanied by a parent or guardian, unless the Common Council authorizes the licensee to allow underage persons on the premises.
- (e) **Licensed Operators Requirement.** A licensed operator shall be stationed at all points of sales at all times.
- (f) **Waiver.** The Common Council may waive or modify the requirements of this Section due to the physical characteristics of the licensed site.
- (g) **Insurance.** The applicant for a temporary fermented malt beverage or wine license must indemnify, defend and hold the City and its employees and agents harmless against all claims, death of any person or any damage to property caused by or resulting from the activities for which the permit is granted. As evidence of the applicant's ability to perform the conditions of the license, the applicant must furnish a Certificate of Comprehensive General Liability insurance with the City of Plymouth. The applicant may be required to furnish a surety bond prior to being granted the license.

(h) **Beer and Liquor Not To Be Carried In.** No person shall bring fermented malt beverages or intoxicating liquor in any form of a container with him, or in his automobile, to any public function within the City of Plymouth for his own consumption, or consumption of others; except only under permission of the Common Council granted for such function. The term public function shall be construed to mean any function that is open to the general public for an admission charge or without admission charge upon any premises in the City.
