- 3. Approval of the Consent Agenda: Motion made by Wilson/Hildebrand to approve all items listed. Upon the call of the roll, all voted age. Motion carries.

  - A. Approval of roadway repairs to Eastern Avenue and County Trunk C. Total project costs to be shared 50/50 with the Sheboygan County Highway Department. Estimated cost of \$14,000 to come from the contingency fund Interim City Administrator Cathy Austin mentioned that this item was recommended by the Public Works & Utilities Committee. Austin said that the city was approached by the Sheboygan County Highway Department to cost share asphalting road repairs to Eastern Avenue / CTH C. The total cost for the city would be \$14,000. Funds would come from the contingency fund. If approved, the work would be completed this year. Motion made by Gilson/Nelson to approve the roadway repairs. Upon the call of the roll, all voted aye. Motion carries.
  - B. Approval of Utility Building Modifications to Service Counter, Estimated cost of \$5,050. Expenditures are eligible under the Routes to Recovery Program: Interim City Administrator Cathy Austin mentioned that the utility service counter modifications were approved at the Public Works & Utilities Committee. Interim Austin provided the council with photographs of the area. Austin said that the modifications are needed to help prevent the spread of COVID-19 as well as provide additional security to utility staff. Estimated cost will be \$5,050. The expenditures are eligible under the Routes to Recovery Program. Motion made by Gilson/Hildebrand to approve the modifications. Upon the call of the roll, all voted aye. Motion carries.
