
- **1.) Approval of Minutes from November 3, 2022;** Motion to approve made by O'Malley and seconded by Schellin. On the roll all voted Aye.

The Toro Company is intending to building a fire pump room on the northwesterly corner of the existing building. They currently draw from the pond to the east and the system is failing. Chief Pafford has made contact with the Toro representative regarding a truck worthy access road from STH 57 to this point for Fire truck access to this part of the building. Member Nicolaus stated this was an old railroad be and probably just needs some top dressing as the base should be fine. DPW Mgr. Austin mentioned a consideration for impervious surface, and that the water main agreement needs to be handled yet with the City Utility. Motion to approve made by Hildebrand and seconded by Nicolaus. On the roll all voted yes to approve.
- **3.) Discussion and possible action:** 1663 Pilgrim Road, Plymouth dba Specialty Sales. Jerod Voskil from A. Chappa Construction addressed the Commission regarding the proposed driveway/parking lot alteration. This alteration will allow through traffic in the building for loading and unloading. DPW Mgr Austin asked about the area proposed as being paved. Voskil replied that it would be a combination of asphalt and concrete installed in the Spring of 2023. Austin and Pafford had no concerns. 13,000 sq. ft. of impervious surface. Motion to approve Nicolaus, and second VanNorwick. On the roll all voted yes to approve.
- 4.) Discussion and possible recommendation: CSM seeking recommendation; LOT 1 AND OUTLOT 1, CSM VOL.26 PG. 269 AND LOT 2, CSM VOL.20, PR. 240 BEING PART OF THE NORTHWEST ¼ OF THE NORTHEAST ¼ AND THE SOUTHWEST ¼ OF THE NORTHEAST ¼ OF SECTION 26, TOWNSHIP 15 NORTH, RANGE 21 EAST. CITY OF PLYMOUTH, SHEBOYGAN COUNTY, WISCONSIN; Chairman Pohlman advised the Commission members that the next 2 agenda items all related to this same group of parcels, and to try to keep on the CSM, but would acknowledge related comments, as one approval needed the other. Devin Winter from Excel Engineering explained to the

Commission members about what the intent of the division, use and Zoning request change. The front lot will be divided into 3 lots, one of which is considered to be without its own road frontage. It was noted that the City's Ordinance, with Plan Commission approval, has the ability to be created as long as it meets the minimum standards for access via another means. Administrator Blakeslee explained that the Staff recommendation was to incorporate a Developer's Agreement with this allowance for lot #3, as shown on the submitted CSM. Chief Pafford stated that this private road should work as it is proposed as being 24 feet wide of paved surface. Schellin inquired about the triangle lot that is shown. Winter explained that this triangle shaped lot was surveyed off as to allow through passage and missing the wetlands that exist in that area. - **5.)** Discussion and possible recommendation: Area located behind 2587 Eastern Ave. Seeking a rezoning from B3 Highway business, to R4 Multifamily. 


# Background:

The request before the Common Council is for the following (diagram attached):

- A Comprehensive Plan Land Use Amendment via proposed Ordinance No. 10 of amend designation of Lot 4 (orange area) from Commercial and Natural Areas to Multi-Family/Residential in the Existing Land Use Map and Future Lan Use Plan Map.
- Rezoning via proposed Ordinance No. 11 a portion of parcel 59271821072 (slashed red area) and 59271821071 from B-3 to R-4 (red triangle area).
- CSM to create Lot 1, 2, and 3 from Parcel 59271821072 (green area).
- CSM to combine a portion of Parcel 59271821072 (slashed red area), Parcel 59271821071 (red triangle lot), and Parcel 59271821042 to create Lot 4 (orange area).

# **Other Consideration:**

- The creation of Lot 3 creates a landlocked parcel. This is permitted Section 14-1-73(e) with the following requirements:
  - Upon approval by the Plan Commission, and following a public hearing before the Common Council, the Common Council may permit development of a lot or parcel which provides access to a public



street by means of a privately owned road or driveway constructed in a corridor approved by the Plan Commission of not less than 60 feet in width, provided however that all structures constructed, or to be constructed upon said lot or parcel, shall conform to the requirements of Title 13 (Zoning), and all other provisions of this section, excepting only as to minimum lot frontage.   - As a result of the requested CSM creating a landlocked parcel (Lot 3), Staff recommends that approval of the CSM be conditional upon a completion of development agreement with the City of Plymouth for any future proposed developments on Parcel 59271821071, 59271821042, and 59271821072. After the CSM is finalized this would refer to Lot 3 and Lot 4.

**Plan Commission Recommendation:** At the meeting on 12/1/22 Plan Commission unanimously recommended that the Common Council approval of the Plankview Green Development based on the Staff recommendation including the requirement of a future development agreement.

Project: Van Horn Retail Master Development Eastern Ave Plymouth, WI 53073

Plankview Green Development, LLC is requesting Comprehensive Plan Amendment, Rezone, and Certified Survey Map (CSM) review and approval for development located on the south side of the intersection of Eastern Ave and Carr Road in the City of Plymouth, Wisconsin. The tax parcel ID's included are 59271821071, 59271821072, and 59271821042. The existing zoning is B-3: Business Commercial on 59271821071 and 59271821072 and R4: Multifamily on 59271821042. The request is to change the comprehensive land use map for all of 59271821071 and a portion of 59271821072, rezone from B-3 to R-4 and then combine via the CSM approval process. The northern portion of 59271821072 is proposed to be split into 3 parcels as shown on the CSM and does not require rezoning or comprehensive land use map amendments. The master development plans for the overall property were approved in July 2022 in preparations for the future development.

The southern side of existing parcel 59271821072, shown on the proposed CSM as Lot 3, is proposed not to have frontage on Eastern Avenue (C.T.H. In June of 2022, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services announced the availability of \$12 million that is available for EMS providers across the state. "Wisconsin's emergency medical services responders are among the first on the scene during our darkest hours—from a heart attack to a house fire—providing consistent, high-quality services when we need them most," said Gov. Evers. "For too long, local communities have been doing more with less, especially in our rural communities who've had to cut critical public safety services due to lack of resources. These investments will help support EMS and health care access across our state by providing EMS providers the support they need to be there when folks need them."

Shortly after the announcement, Assistant Chief Beebe took the lead and started working on the application process for the EMS Flex Grant. The initial ask from Plymouth Fire was for \$240,000 for the purchase of a new ambulance.

On September 19<sup>th</sup>, 2002, Plymouth Fire was awarded the Wisconsin DHS Flex Grant in the amount of \$89,005. With a shortfall of \$150,000 from the original request, the department needed to find a different avenue for the purchase of an ambulance.

Plymouth Fire and Rescue is asking the City of Plymouth Common Council to consider approving the purchase of a 2013 Braun Ambulance from Elite Ambulance Sales for the price of \$83,000 from the funds acquired through the Wisconsin DHS Flex Grant.

# Award Special Conditions

- 1. Per 2021 Wisconsin Act 185, a law enforcement agency that receives a grant under this funding shall do all of the following for at least 3 years from the date of this award:
  - a) Equip with a body camera all law enforcement officers who have primary duties involving traffic patrol, beat patrol, or responding to calls from the public requiring assistance.
  - b) Require an officer who is equipped with a body camera to activate the camera in situations in which the officer has an enforcement or investigative contact with a member of the public, including a traffic stop, arrest, search, interrogation, or interview, or in any other situation in which the officer has contact with a member of the public that becomes adversarial after the initial contact.
- 2. 2021 Wisconsin Act 185 requires recipients to ensure the cameras are operation for at least a 3-year period after the purchases are made. Therefore, DOJ will allow up to three years of ongoing expenses, such as digital storage or subscription fees, during the grant performance period. Grantees with ongoing expenses should be invoiced semi-annually by their vendor and request reimbursement from DOJ semi-annually for these expenses.
- 3. Applicant certifies to comply with all the requirements of 2021 Wisconsin Act 185, including to maintain the camera equipment, accessories, and adequate digital video storage for a minimum of 3 years from the date of the award.

### **Background:**

GASB, the Governmental Accounting Standards Board that establishes accounting and financial reporting standards for U.S. state and local governments, issued GASB Statement 87 on June, 2017. The objective of GASB 87 is to better meet the information needs of the financial statement users by improving accounting and financial reporting for <u>leases</u> by governments. Due to a lack of initial guidance and later disruptions caused by COVID, the effective date of this statement was postposed to all reporting years beginning after June 15, 2021. This would make 2022 the first reporting year for the City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities.

In regards to this effective date, the Finance staff has prepared a Lease Accounting Policy which will provide a consistent basis of accounting for leases for the City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities. Baker Tilly has provided us with an outline which has been further modified by the Finance staff to fit the specific needs of the City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities.

# 1. General Policy and Purpose

The purpose of this Policy is to provide a consistent basis of accounting for City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities with respect to Lease Accounting. Governmental Accounting Standards Board Statement No. 87 (GASB 87), "Leases," is the applicable accounting guidance and is effective January 1, 2022, for City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities.

# 2. Identifying if the Contract Contains a Lease

Once a contract is executed (lease inception) that appears to fall under the scope of lease accounting, City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities will perform an assessment to evaluate if the contract contains a lease.

A lease conveys the right to use an underlying asset for a period of time in an exchange or exchangelike transaction. At the inception of an arrangement, the parties should determine whether the contract contains a lease by assessing both of the following:

- Whether there is an identified, non-financial asset
- Whether the contract conveys the right to control the use of the identified asset in exchange for consideration for a period of time
  - Two tests must be met:

1) The right to obtain the present service capacity from use of the underlying asset as specified in the contract; **and** 

2) The right to determine the nature and manner of use of the underlying asset as specified in the contract.<sup>1</sup>

In many cases, the identification of a lease is straightforward. However, the full set of rules are very detailed and can require additional research

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Although GASB does not provide additional interpretive guidance on the "nature and manner of use," City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities looks at the control over those decision-making rights that are most relevant (i.e., most significant) to the economic benefits derived from an asset's use. Examples are: 1) right to change the type of output; 2) right to change when the output is produced; 3) right to change where the output is produced; 4) right to change whether output is produced and, if so, the quantity produced.

# 3. Scope Exception

The following leases are accounted for under accounting guidance other than GASB 87:

- Intangible Assets except fixed-term easements
- Perpetual Easements
- Biological Assets, including timber, living plants, living animals
- Leases of Inventory
- Service Concession Arrangements that are accounted for under GASB 60
- Supply Contracts, such as power purchase agreements
- \$0, \$1 or any contracts substantially below market value
- Grazing rights
- Telecommunications leases unless the lessee controls the nature and manner of use of the underlying asset
- Automatic transfer of ownership (record as a financed purchase)
- Leases that are eliminated upon consolidation
- Certain regulated lessor leases (see separate section)

# 4. Short-term Lease Exception

A short-term lease is a lease that, at the commencement of the lease term, has a maximum possible term under the lease contract of 12 months or less, including any options to extend, regardless of the probability of being exercised. For a lease that is cancelable by either the lessee or the lessor, such as a rolling month-to-month lease or a year-to-year lease, the maximum possible term is the noncancellable period, including any notice periods.

A short-term lease is not recorded on the balance sheet (except that if a lessee, City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities will recognize pre-paid rent if payments are made in advance or a rent payable for rent due if payments are to be made in a subsequent reporting period; if a lessor City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities will recognize a liability if payments are received in advance or an accounts receivable for rent due if payments are to be received subsequent to the reporting period). For short-term leases, City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities will recognize in the contract.

# 5. Capitalization Threshold

The City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities has adopted a capitalization threshold of \$50,000 per lease as measured by the principal due over the life of the lease (vs annually). The City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities will evaluate its lease inventory each year to determine if the cumulative amount of leases are material to the reporting entity. If cumulatively deemed to be immaterial for the governmental activities or business type activities, they would not be recorded in the financial statements.

When establishing this capitalization threshold, City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities separately evaluated the effects of not recognizing the lease liability and the Right-to-Use ("RTU") asset on the balance sheet (both individually and in the aggregate). City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities did not:

- Evaluate the effect of non-recognition on a 'net' basis i.e., considering only the net effect on the balance sheet (RTU asset less lease liability);
- Evaluate without consideration of the effect on disclosures; or

• Default to a threshold used for another non-GAAP policy, such as that used for not capitalizing property, plant and equipment or prepaid expenses.

# 6. Lease Terms

The lease term is the period during which a lessee has a noncancellable right to use an underlying asset, plus the following periods, if applicable:

- Periods covered by a lessee's option to extend the lease if it is reasonably certain, based on all relevant factors, that the lessee will exercise that option
- Periods covered by a lessee's option to terminate the lease if it is reasonably certain, based on all relevant factors, that the lessee will not exercise that option
- Periods covered by a lessor's option to extend the lease if it is reasonably certain, based on all relevant factors, that the lessor will exercise that option
- Periods covered by a lessor's option to terminate the lease if it is reasonably certain, based on all relevant factors, that the lessor will not exercise that option

Periods in which both the lessee and lessor have an option to terminate the lease without permission from the other party (or if both parties have to agree to extend) are cancellable periods and are excluded from the lease term.

A fiscal funding or cancellation clause allows governmental lessees to cancel a lease, typically on an annual basis, if the government does not appropriate funds for the lease payments. This type of clause only affects the lease term if it is reasonably certain that the clause will be exercised.

At the commencement date, City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities will include the periods in the lease term having considered all relevant factors that create an economic incentive for the lessee (that is, contract-based, underlying-asset-based, government-specific, and market-based factors). In addition, the history of exercising options to extend or terminate the lease and the extent to which the asset underlying the lease is essential to the provision of government services are factors that should be considered. Those factors shall be considered together, and the existence of any one factor does not necessarily signify that a lessee is reasonably certain to exercise or not to exercise an option.

# 7. Initial Direct Cost

Initial direct costs are incremental costs of a lease (excluding City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities labor) that would not have been incurred if the lease had not been obtained. City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities typically does not have such incremental costs, but would capitalize them as part of the lease asset if any are identified and material.

# 8. Contracts that Transfer Ownership

A contract that (a) transfers ownership of the underlying asset to the lessee by the end of the contract and (b) does not contain termination options, but that may contain a fiscal funding or cancellation clause that is not reasonably certain of being exercised, should be reported as a financed purchase of the underlying asset by the lessee or a sale of the asset by the lessor.

# 9. Contract Combination

City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities will combine two or more lease contracts entered into at or near the same time with the same counterparty (or related parties) and consider the contracts as a single transaction if either of the following criteria are met:

a. The contracts are negotiated as a package with a single objective

b. The amount of consideration to be paid in one contract depends on the price or performance of the other contract.

# 10. Portfolio Approach

If a lease involves multiple underlying assets and the assets have the same lease terms (including the same start and end date) and the assets are in the same major class of assets, the lessee and the lessor may account for the underlying assets as a single lease<sup>2</sup>.

# 11. Multiple Components in a Contract

If there are multiple lease components in a contract, the contract price is allocated based on the relative standalone price of the separate lease components on the basis of their observable standalone prices.

# 12. Embedded Leases

The right to control the use of an asset may not necessarily be documented, in form, as a lease agreement. Often, the right to use an identified asset is embedded in an arrangement that may appear to be a supply arrangement or service contract. Therefore, City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities will consider all of the terms of an arrangement to determine whether it contains a lease. When performing the analysis to determine if an arrangement contains an embedded lease, multiple arrangements may be considered to be a single transaction (see Contract Combination section).

# 13. Intra-Entity Leases

City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities' leases between entities under common control are not recorded on the balance sheet of either entity.

# 14. Identifying Lease Components

A <u>lease component</u> is a right to use an underlying asset (i.e., a lease) or a bundle of rights to use underlying assets (e.g. building, equipment, floor space, etc.). Some contracts may contain the right to use multiple assets; however, each individual asset is only a separate lease component if the criteria below are met:

- 1. Lessee can benefit from the Right-to-Use (Asset) either on its own or together with other resources readily available to the lessee, AND
- 2. Right-to-Use is neither highly dependent on, nor highly interrelated with, the other Right(s)-to-Use in the contract.

Key additional guidance:

• Notwithstanding the guidance above, City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities will account for the right to use land as a separate lease component unless the accounting effect of doing so would

be insignificant (for example, separating the land element would have no effect on lease classification of any lease component or the amount recognized for the land lease component would be insignificant).

- Variable rental payments that depend on an index or a rate (such as the Consumer Price Index or a market interest rate) are included in lease calculations using the index or rate as of the commencement date. Note: In future periods when the rate or index changes, the lease liability will not be remeasured for this difference. Other variable payments are excluded from lease calculations.
- Rental payments that are in-substance fixed (i.e., variable payments but provides for a minimum or floor payment that must be made, therefore this floor amount of the payment is unavoidable) are also included in lease calculations.

<u>Non-lease components</u> are defined as other components in the contract that transfer a good or service (e.g. common area maintenance, equipment maintenance, use of shared gym in a building, etc.). If a contract contains lease and non-lease components, the lease and non-lease components are accounted for as separate contracts.

Contracts may include other activities which do not transfer a good or service to the lessee. <u>These are</u> <u>not considered components of the contract</u>. An example of this is a reimbursement or payment (to a third party or to the lessor) of the lessor's costs, such as property tax or insurance. Sales taxes paid by the lessee are not components of the contract.

# 15. Amortization of Lease Asset

Lease assets are amortized straight-line over the shorter of the lease term or the useful life of the underlying asset, except that if a lease contains a purchase option that the lessee has determined is reasonably certain of being exercised, the lease asset should be amortized over the useful life of the underlying asset.<sup>3</sup>

The useful life of an asset (i.e., the period over which City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities will depreciate the asset) is the period over which the asset is expected to contribute directly or indirectly to future cash flows. The useful life of an asset can differ depending on the asset's intended use by City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities.

# 16. Certain Regulated Leases

Certain leases are subject to external laws, regulations, or legal rulings. For example, the U.S. Department of Transportation and the Federal Aviation Administration regulate aviation leases between airports and air carriers and other aeronautical uses. Lessors should not apply the provisions of GASB 87 to these leases. See GASB 87, paragraph 43 for more details. City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities does not currently have any regulated leases that meet this definition.

# LEASE ACCOUNTING

# 17. Initial Recognition and Measurement-Lessee

# Measuring the lease liability

On the lease commencement date, City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities is required to measure and record a lease liability equal to the present value of the remaining lease payments, discounted using the rate implicit in the lease (or if that rate cannot be readily determined, the lessee's incremental borrowing rate).

The liability includes the following:

- Fixed payments
- Variable payments that depend on an index or rate (such as the Consumer Price Index or market interest rate), initially measured using the index or rate as of the commencement of the lease term
- Variable payments that are fixed in substance
- Amounts that are reasonably certain of being required to be paid by the lessee under residual value guarantees
- The exercise price of a purchase option if it is reasonably certain that the lessee will exercise that option
- Payments for penalties for terminating the lease, if the lease term reflects the lessee exercising (1) an option to terminate the lease or (2) a fiscal funding or cancellation clause
- Any lease incentives receivable from the lessor (reduction to liability)
- Any other payments that are reasonably certain of being required based on an assessment of all relevant factors

# Measuring the Right-to-Use Asset

At the commencement date, the cost of the right-to-use asset will consist of the following:

- The amount of the initial measurement of the lease liability
- Any lease payments made to the lessor at or before the commencement date, minus any lease incentives received (such as major maintenance allowances or leasehold improvement allowances)
- Any initial direct costs incurred by the lessee

# **18. Initial Recognition and Measurement-Lessor**

# Measuring the Lease Receivable

On the lease commencement date, City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities is required to measure and record a lease receivable equal to the present value of the lease payment expected to be received during the lease, discounted using the City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities' incremental borrowing rate. This amount is reduced by any provision for uncollectible.

The receivable includes the following:

- Fixed payments
- Variable payments that depend on an index or rate (such as the Consumer Price Index or market interest rate), initially measured using the index or rate as of the commencement of the lease term
- Variable payments that are fixed in substance

- Residual value guarantee payments that are fixed in substance
- Any lease incentives payable to the lessee (reduction to the receivable)

# Measuring the Deferred Inflow of Resources

At the commencement date, the deferred inflow of resources will consist of all of the following:

- The amount of the initial measurement of the lease receivable
- Any lease payments received from the lessee at or before the commencement date that relate to future periods, minus any lease incentives received (such as major maintenance allowances or leasehold improvement allowances)

Note: Any initial direct costs incurred by the lessee are expensed as incurred.

# 19. Subsequent Recognition and Measurement-Lessee

Over the lease term, City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities should amortize the right-to-use asset and record interest expense on the lease liability created at lease commencement. Any payments made should be allocated first to the accrued interest liability and then to the lease liability.

Expense classification	Income statement recognition pattern
Amortization expense	Straight-line recognition over the shorter of the
	useful life of the asset or the lease term
Interest expense	Interest method

The following table describes how these amounts are recognized:

# 20. Subsequent Recognition and Measurement-Lessor

City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities will not derecognize the underlying asset and it will continue to depreciate the asset in accordance with its normal depreciation policy. However, if the lease requires the lessee to return the asset to City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities in its original or enhanced condition, City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities will not depreciate the underlying asset during the lease term. City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities will record lease income on a straight-line basis over the lease term. Any payments received should be allocated first to the accrued interest receivable and then to the lease receivable. City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities has variable consideration in certain lease contracts. Due to the uncertainty of the amount of variable consideration, revenue related to the variable consideration will not be recorded until such amounts meet the definition of revenue.

# 21. Subleases and Leaseback Transactions

Subleases are treated as transactions separate from the original lease. The original lessee that becomes the lessor in a sublease should account for the original lease and the sublease as separate transactions, as a lessee and lessor, respectively. A transaction qualifies for sale-leaseback accounting only if it includes a sale. Otherwise, it is a borrowing. The sale and lease portions of a transaction should be accounted for as separate sale and lease transactions, except that any difference between the carrying value of the capital asset that was sold and the net proceeds from the sale should be reported as a deferred inflow of resources or a deferred outflow of resources and recognized over the term of the lease.

Lease-Leaseback transactions should be reported net, due to the presumed right of setoff with the counterparty.

# 22. Lessee Modifications and Ongoing Reassessments

Certain events can occur that can result in modifications of the lease or cause City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities to have to reassess assumptions used in calculating the lease and RTU asset, in which the lease liability and RTU asset will need to be remeasured based on updated assumptions.

# Modifications

A modification occurs when changes occur in the terms of a lease contract and is typically issued in the form of an amendment to the lease based on the renegotiated terms between City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities and the counterparty. Examples include a lease extension, an early termination, or a change in timing of lease payments or leasing additional space in the same building.

The effective date of a modification is when the amendment is signed by both parties. When a modification occurs, the modification would be treated as if it were a separate lease if:

- The modification gives the lessee an additional lease asset by adding one or more underlying assets that were not included in the original lease contract, **and**
- The increase in lease payments for the additional lease asset does not appear to be unreasonable based on (1) the terms of the amended lease contract and (2) professional judgment, maximizing the use of observable information (for example, using readily available observable stand-alone prices).

If the modification is not accounted for as a separate lease, City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities will remeasure the lease liability using the then-current discount rate and adjust the RTU asset for the modified lease as of the modification date.

### Reassessments

Reassessments should be considered of the lease term (i.e. renewal/termination options) and purchase options upon the occurrence of certain triggering events which could impact the initial assumptions that were used in measuring the lease liability and RTU asset. Examples include:

- An event written into the contract has occurred that obliges City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities to exercise the renewal option
- City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities exercises an option that had not previously been determined was reasonably certain of being exercised
- City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities decides not to exercise an option that had been previously determined it would be reasonably certain of being exercised
- An assessment of all relevant factors indicates that the likelihood of a residual value guarantee being paid has changed from reasonably certain to not reasonably certain, or vice versa.
- An assessment of all relevant factors indicates that the likelihood of a purchase option being exercised has changed from reasonably certain to not reasonably certain, or vice versa.
- A contingency, upon which some or all the variable payments that will be made over the remainder of the lease term are based, is resolved such that those payments now meet the criteria for measuring the lease liability. For example, an event occurs that causes variable payments that were contingent on the performance or use of the underlying asset to become fixed payments for the remainder of the lease term.

Generally, triggering events will relate to factors that are within City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities' control, and events that are based on market factors alone (e.g., increase in property value) would not cause a triggering event, since they are not within City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities' control.

Upon reassessment, City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities will remeasure the lease liability using the then-current discount rate and adjust the RTU asset for the lease as of the reassessment date.

### Monitoring process for reassessments

Triggering events are monitored as events occur and at least annually.

# 23. Impairment

Assets leased out should be assessed for impairment, as necessary. Impairment should be performed at the asset group level.

# 24. Lease Terminations

The lessee and lessor should account for an amendment during the reporting period resulting in a decrease in the lessee's right to use the underlying asset (for example, the lease term is shortened, or the number of underlying assets is reduced) as a partial or full lease termination.

A lessee generally should account for the partial or full lease termination by reducing the carrying values of the lease asset and lease liability and recognizing a gain or loss for the difference. However, if the lease is terminated as a result of the lessee purchasing an underlying asset from the lessor, the lease asset should be reclassified to the appropriate class of owned asset.

A lessor should account for the partial or full lease termination by reducing the carrying values of the lease receivable and related deferred inflow of resources and recognizing a gain or loss for the difference. However, if the lease is terminated as a result of the lessee purchasing an underlying asset from the lessor, the carrying value of the underlying asset should be derecognized and included in the calculation of any resulting gain or loss.

# 25. Disclosures

### Lessees

- A general description of its leasing arrangements, including (1) the basis, terms, and conditions on which variable payments not included in the measurement of the lease liability are determined and (2) the existence, terms, and conditions of residual value guarantees provided by the lessee not included in the measurement of the lease liability
- b) The total amount of lease assets, and the related accumulated amortization, disclosed separately from other capital assets. This can be disclosed on the face of the balance sheet or in the Notes to Financial Statements.
- c) The amount of lease assets by major classes of underlying assets, disclosed separately from other capital assets
- d) The amount of outflows of resources recognized in the reporting period for variable payments not previously included in the measurement of the lease liability
- e) The amount of outflows of resources recognized in the reporting period for other payments, such as residual value guarantees or termination penalties, not previously included in the measurement of the lease liability

- f) Principal and interest requirements to maturity, presented separately, for the lease liability for each of the five subsequent fiscal years and in five-year increments thereafter
- g) Commitments under leases before the commencement of the lease term
- h) The components of any loss associated with an impairment (the impairment loss and any related change in the lease liability).

A lessee also should provide relevant disclosures for the following transactions, if applicable:

- Sublease transactions
- Sale-leaseback transactions
- Lease-leaseback transactions. A lease-leaseback transaction should be accounted for as a net transaction. The gross amounts of each portion of the transaction should be disclosed.

# Lessors

- a) A general description of its leasing arrangements, including the basis, terms, and conditions on which any variable payments not included in the measurement of the lease receivable are determined
- b) The total amount of inflows of resources (for example, lease revenue, interest revenue, and any other lease-related inflows) recognized in the reporting period from leases, if that amount cannot be determined based on the amounts displayed on the face of the financial statements
- c) The amount of inflows of resources recognized in the reporting period for variable and other payments not previously included in the measurement of the lease receivable, including inflows of resources related to residual value guarantees and termination penalties
- d) The existence, terms, and conditions of options by the lessee to terminate the lease or abate payments if the lessor government has issued debt whereby the principal and interest payments are secured by the lease payments.

A lessor also should provide relevant disclosures for the following transactions, if applicable:

- Leases of assets that are investments
- Certain regulated leases
- Sublease transactions
- Sale-leaseback transactions
- Lease-leaseback transactions

# 26. Statement of Cash Flows

If a lease results in a lessee recognizing a lease asset, the cash flows (including the interest portion) should be included in the capital and related financing activities category as an outflow in the lessee's statement of cash flows.

# GLOSSARY

The following are some of the terms most often referred to within City of Plymouth/Plymouth Utilities' contracts as well as the policy guidance within this document.

- **a.** Commencement Date of the Lease: The date on which a lessor makes an underlying asset available for use by a lessee.
- **b.** Embedded Lease: The right to use an identified asset that is embedded in an arrangement that may appear to be a supply arrangement or service contract.

- **c.** Fair Value: The price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.
- **d. Implicit Rate:** The rate of interest that, at a given date, causes the aggregate present value of (a) the lease payments and (b) the amount that a lessor expects to derive from the underlying asset following the end of the lease term to equal the sum of (1) the fair value of the underlying asset minus any related investment tax credit retained and expected to be realized by the lessor and (2) any initial direct costs of the lessor.
- e. Inception Date: The date of the lease agreement or commitment, if earlier. For purposes of this definition, a commitment shall be in writing, signed by the parties in interest to the transaction, and shall specifically set forth the principal terms of the transaction.
- **f. Incremental Borrowing Rate**: The rate of interest that a lessee would have to pay to borrow over a similar term an amount equal to the lease payments in a similar economic environment.
- **g.** Initial Direct Costs: Incremental costs of a lease that would not have been incurred if the lease had not been obtained.
- **h.** Lease Component: Examples include a piece of equipment, a building or land.
- **i.** Lease Term: The noncancellable period for which a lessee has the right to use an underlying asset, together with all of the following:
  - Periods covered by an option to extend the lease if the lessee is reasonably certain to exercise that option
  - Periods covered by an option to terminate the lease if the lessee is reasonably certain not to exercise that option
  - Periods covered by an option to extend (or not terminate) the lease in which exercise of the option is controlled by the lessor.
- **j. Minimum Lease Payments:** Payments over the lease term including the amount of any bargain purchase option, premium, and any residual value guaranteed, and excluding any rental relating to costs to be met by the lessor and any contingent rentals.
- **k.** Non-Components under Lease Accounting: Examples includes administrative tasks to initiate the lease and reimbursements or payment of lessor's costs (including property taxes, interest and insurance). Lessee sales taxes paid over the course of the lease term are non-component (executory) periodic costs.
- **I.** Non-Lease Component: Examples include operating a leased asset on behalf of a lessee, training lessee personnel to operate the asset, repair or maintenance of the leased asset, security services, consumables/supplies or management services.
- **m.** Residual Value Guarantee: A guarantee made to a lessor that the value of an underlying asset returned to the lessor at the end of a lease will be at least a specified amount
- **n. Right-to-Use ("RTU") Asset:** An asset that represents a lessee's right to use an underlying asset for the lease term
- **o. Short-Term Lease:** A lease that, at the commencement date, has a lease term (as defined above) of 12 months or less and does not include an option to purchase the underlying asset that the lessee is reasonably certain to exercise.
