Frey attended an intensive 4 week long K9 handler course where he is trained to detect the odors of narcotics (cocaine, marijuana, heroin, and methamphetamine). Frey is also trained to track those who flee law enforcement, and those who may be at risk or lost (missing juveniles or elderly).
